Compass Pay

Compass Pay is available using the Compass which is accessible for all families. Through Compass we invite Parents/Carers to make a financial contribution to support our school in the following categories:

- Voluntary Contributions to the College's curriculum
- Other Voluntary Contributions
- Extra - Curricular Items and Activities – not voluntary – these are charged on a user pay basis.

Parent/Carers new to our College will be provided with login details to the Compass App and a booklet of instructions.

Financial Support for Families

Bairnsdale Secondary College understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)
- regular contributions plan for Extra-Curricular Items and Activities
- State Schools Relief (SSR) e.g. uniform and textbook support

If you hold a current concession card, Veteran Affairs Gold card or are a temporary foster carer, you are eligible for the CSEF (Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund). Please complete the application form and return it to the College for processing. This needs to be completed each year.

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
